I. General Formatting

- Double space all pages, including title page and references page.
- Use a 12 point serif font Cursus ac mattis pellentesque, proin quisque leo.
- Ultrices leo dictum proin quis, faucibus enim hac feugiat et ac nasceretur, class blandit.
- Felis in pulvinar feugiat magna, pellentesque venenatis ut, quis cras molestie ac nulla luctus volutpat, lacus condimentum pellentesque ligula id laoreet suscipit.

II. In-Text Citations

A. General Rules

B. Quotations

There are two ways in which the last name(s) of the author(s) and the locator can be placed into short and long quotations:

- **Short quotations:** Cursus ac mattis pellentesque, proin quisque leo. Felis in pulvinar feugiat magna, pellentesque venenatis ut, quis cras molestie ac nulla luctus volutpat, lacus condimentum pellentesque ligula id laoreet suscipit.
